Reflections on Smilansky model

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The aim of this talk is to analyze several classes of Schrödinger operators with potentials that are below unbounded but their negative part is localized in narrow channels. A prototype of such a behavior can be found in Smilansky model devised to illustrate that an an irreversible behavior is possible even if the heat bath to which the systems is coupled has a finite number of degrees of freedom. We review its properties and analyze a regular version of this model, as well as another system in which x^py^p potential is amended by a negative radially symmetric term. All of them have the common property that they exhibit an abrupt parameter-dependent spectral transition: if the coupling constant exceeds a critical value the spectrum will cover the whole real axis, corresponding to the particle escape to infinity. We also discuss resonance effects in the Smilansky model. The results come from a common work with Diana Barseghyan, Vladimir Lotoreichik and Miloš Tater.

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
